



### 2022-2027 Strategic Goals


- Grow bolt replacement by 60%: Increase to 1,000 bolts a year from 500

   more wag bags and composting toilets
- Increase trail work capacity by 50%
- Preserve and gain climbing access on the Front Range
- Earn the reputation of BCC as the go-to resource for the Front Range climbing community
- Replace 75% of aging bolts in Boulder Canyon
- Expand Outreach and Education
- Maintain or reduce the number of raptor closure violations year over year of BCC monitored areas








# Anchor Replacement Program 2022: Highlights


# 2nd Annual Backyard Bivy
